Harmony Gallup has been accepted into these dazzling halls of academic excellence, and as a community we congratulate her and wish her well.

SMUS is a school driven by success and it has a reputation for going the extra mile, and then further still. For example, it is the number-one school in Canada for "equity and excellence" in the College Board's Advanced Placement. What does that mean exactly? Well, it teaches University level courses to high school students, giving them a head start when they leave the school. The standards are high. Harmony's application process included multiple interviews and tests.

Not only did she sail through them, along the way she qualified for the \$25,000 Indigenous Peoples within Canada Awards Scholarship.

"I'm super happy and proud of my Granddaughter," said Fort McKay's Elder of Elders, 91-year-old Lina Gallup. "She is an extraordinary young woman – takes after her Grandmother." Her parents, Alicia La Rue and Cort Gallup, echo Lina's sentiments. "This was all Harmony's effort," said her Father. "She did all the work throughout the application process. I am so proud of her and everything she has achieved so far, and excited about what is ahead for her." With this, Harmony's achievements just went from impressive to stratospheric. Just recently she was the first winner of the Elsie Fabian School's Cree award, the latest in a long line of scholastic achievements. Now, the world is her stage. Before all the examinations and interviews, Harmony was assigned a guide and leader to help her through the process. The student adviser, an Ojibwe from Ontario, told Harmony that 'going to school at SMUS is like going to school with all your best friends.' She also left a challenge for Harmony. "As I am graduating this year you will have to replace me and represent our people well. Show the other students from all over the world how cool we are."

Anna Mercredi awarded a RARA at just 8 years old

The Regional Aboriginal Recognition Awards (RARA) were started in 1988 to recognize the positive contributions that Aboriginal people (Metis, First Nation, Inuit) within the Region make in everyday life. It gives us all the opportunity to acknowledge individuals that have made a difference to the community at large. Most importantly, this recognition is from within; it is selected for the Aboriginal people of the region, by those selfsame people. The Awards, in the words of the RARA Vision Statement, bestow appreciation for the achievements of the people, and that the awards themselves should, through this recognition, make a positive impact on the lives of the people.

As a result, these presentations have been presented to many of our high achievers, Elders, and sports, culture, and business icons. Some of the categories speak to the years of experience recognized, while the lifetime achievement award is self-evident in the qualities needed for a winner. Even the junior achievement prizes are either acknowledging a specific talent, or some years of work at an art, sport or charitable event. From all of this you may conclude

that when Anna Mercredi was given an award this year, she had done something special. After all, Anna was only 8 at the time. And she had.

In Anna's case, she received this award for a lifetime of achievement.

How can that be, you ask. This is what the Principal of her school, Thomas Andrews, had to say.

"Anna was not nominated for this award for any one particular act. She has shown us through her actions and her words that she is passionate and proud of who she is, and her family heritage. She has been excited to share her culture with others here at the school, and has been active in our Indigenous learning opportunities as well. She has made us proud of the way she represents our school as one of our Elders Keepers as well."

The Deputy Principal, Nazia Hiscock, had more to say, all in the same vein. "Anna brings the strength of her Mother, Grandmother and Aunties to school events. She participated in a family feast and a round dance with traditional drummers from Onion Lake, Elders in the community and former Chief of Fort McMurray First Nation, Robert Cree. She also

has signed a contract with the Arctic Winter Games to honour her ancestors through a jingle dance.”

A contract, for a jingle dance, at an international sporting event. Did we mention she’s 8? The list is long. There was the time at the Christmas Concert where another student, without their EA for the event, was reassured by Anna, singing together with each other and holding hands. Then there is the special respect she has as an Elders Keeper for Mosom Robert Cree, a member of the FMPSPD Elders Council. She welcomed him, offered tobacco and followed protocol to ensure his needs were taken care of.

She also has taken the opportunity at school to share her traditional learning and culture, talking to her class about the importance of Elders teachings, smudging and cultural respect. At assembly one month she used the teachings of the bear/ courage to perform her jingle dance, with her Auntie Lydia, in front of over 500 students and parents, along with her Mom, Aunties, Grandmothers and other knowledge keepers. She also has performed her jingle dancing for FMPSPD Board of Trustees Chair Linda

Mywaart and the other Trustees. She has been a leader, inspiring other Indigenous students who have begun their love of Pow Wow dancing. In her classroom, she has shared her traditional teachings of smudging during sharing circle, and with her teacher, shared the importance of her jingle dance regalia.

Note some of these points. She is showcasing her culture in front of large audiences, inspiring other indigenous youth to explore their culture and representing her people at the highest level. It’s not just the 500 at assembly; the Arctic Winter Games had an international audience in five different countries when Anna danced for them. I’m sure we mentioned she was only 8 at the time. We’ll keep an eye out for you Anna. After you have already achieved so much, it will be interesting to see how you deal with the heady heights of 9, or 10. The Swahili proverb - it takes a village to raise a child – means that no child grows to fulfillment on their own. We congratulate Anna as we also congratulate her Mom Lori-Lei and her ‘village of relatives and other Aunties, all of whom have helped make Anna proud of who she is and where she comes from.
