ort McKay First Nation member **Bryce Fabian,** aka B Fabian, has officially partnered with V13 Promotions to bring his highly anticipated album Endeavors to life. This exciting collaboration marks a pivotal moment in his career, as the album's promotion will be strategically handled to maximize its impact and reach. In the lead-up to the full release in May 2025, Bryce will also be releasing two singles from the album, giving fans an early taste of the heartfelt and powerful tracks that embody his signature country style.

Featuring 12 original songs, all written by Bryce himself, Endeavors will showcase collaborations with Indigenous artists like Jarrid Lee. It will reflect Bryce's deep connection to his roots while pushing the boundaries of modern country music. Smith at the Oil Sands Trade Expo held
recently in Fort McMurray. In his speech prior
to the introduction, Chief Powder stressed the
importance of respectful co-operation between
First Nations, industry, and the provincial
government. He gave an overview of Fort McKay
First Nation's growth, linking it to the history of
oil sands development.

Premier Smith in her talk stressed the importance of the oil industry to the economic prosperity of the province, and her government's intent to ensure that responsible development continues.

Since 1985 the Oil Sands Expo has been an important industry event. In addition to a

The Fort McKay First Nation community originated in the Moose Lake area, so when the Elders go back to Moose Lake every year, they are preserving traditions and honouring our culture and a way of life that goes back thousands of years.

The Elders were taken by McMurray Aviation up to the lake. It is a popular annual event and Paradise Bay is a welcoming site every time they return.

Among the more popular entertainments are the Bingo games. Congratulations Edith, winning the 5 card Bingo our times, and Josephine who claimed the \$200 gift card.
